The objectives of the NCWCDO are:

- To provide an independent Charitable Organization, made up of NCWC members and members of its affiliates, that can work together to develop and support educational and social welfare programs.
- To advance literacy and basic education and provision of skill training for women and girls in Third World countries and Canada, and, when deemed necessary, provision for accommodation and meals during prescribed periods of training.
- To contribute to the general well-being of all members of a designated community through specific projects such as wells in Third World country to provide for pure water; a social or cultural facility to be available for recreation, health clinics, crafts, and adult education

including health, nutrition and sanitation courses.
